- A cooperation network set up in 1993 between the European Commission and the Public Employment Services of the European Union, the EEA countries of Norway, Iceland and Liechtenstein, plus Switzerland.
- EURES web portal <http://eures.europa.eu> is a one-stop-shop for practical information on job mobility with more than one million job vacancies, 614 000 CVs and 23 500 employers registered
- A dedicated network of over 800 EURES advisers provides expert guidance on everything to do with worker mobility, from recruitment and placement to social security, taxes and working conditions.

Main objectives of EURES



- Common European Labour Market
- Promote occupational & geographic mobility
- Smooth over labour market shortages in certain sectors, occupations or regions

- Efficient service for clients in all Public Offices
- EURES services are free of charge to everybody

Visibility of EURES

...one third of respondents living in Estonia have heard of EURES and 5% of respondents say they have used EURES - *the highest levels of any countries in the EU.*

Eurobarometer mobility survey concludes that more than *one third (38%) Estonians envisages working abroad at some point in the future* and 70 % respondents would like to receive information about job vacancies from a public employment service.
