

Transfer of Estonian Best Practices to Support the Competitiveness of the Georgian VET Sector

Project period: 2013-2015

The aim of the project: to enhance the competitiveness of Georgian VET colleges in developing VET provision to meet the needs of employers and students. The project focuses on co-operation of 8 Georgian pilot colleges with their 8 Estonian counterparts and the Georgian Ministry of Education and Research.

The expected outcomes are:

development of 5-8 new modular curricula to meet the needs of the labour market and students, incl. introduction of general competencies and integration of students with special needs;
up-grading teachers' pedagogical and andragogical competencies; analyses and further development of leadership competencies to enhance the quality-related work in the colleges; enhancement of the effectiveness of co-operation with the employers *inter alia* organisation of on-the-job training;
improvement of the attractiveness and international co-operation in VET, incl. transfer of best practices to other VET institutions in Georgia.

Project partners: in Estonia there are 8 VET schools: Tallinn Polytechnic School, Tartu, Pärnu and Ida-Viru Vocational Training Centres, Tallinn Construction School, Estonian Maritime School, Rakvere Vocational School, Olustvere Service and Rural Economics School.

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
