

Transferability of Skills, Competition and Assessment Standards for better recognition of skills within EU (TOSCA)

Project period: September 2014-August 2017

The aim of the project: to promote stronger coherence between different EU and national skills transparency and recognition tools, as well as to ensure that skills and qualifications can easily be recognized nationally and across borders.

The expected outcomes are:

- compiling selected skills standard descriptions to indicate core tasks and competencies a young professional should master in regards to

practical work and learning outcomes;

- development of standardised test models and assessment toolkit.

These are practical representations of what a young professional should master as well as the criteria and procedures of how to assess work to be done to produce such models;

- development of the database to input and store all the final versions of the documents that will be elaborated during this project, i.e., common terminology and work methodology, commonly agreed 4 skills standard descriptions, learning outcomes, test models and assessment toolkits.
